In March and April, case counts spiked in parts of Europe and Asia, including India. But like most outbreaks last year — except the ones in China — the latest surge shone a light on the pathogen's declining virulence. Though the virus still kills, the global death rate has come down drastically — from 1,00,000 a week at the peak of the pandemic in January 2021 to less than 4,000 in early May. Covid infections have plunged by more than 90 per cent in the last five months and healthcare systems are no longer stressed. The possibility of a damaging new variant emerging is also remote. However, given the past unpredictability of the virus, medical authorities worldwide cannot afford to slacken on surveillance efforts, such as genome tracing. The focus should now be on the long-term management of infections, especially among the aged and those with weak immune systems. Covid, the Ebola virus and coronaviruses that cause the Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) and Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS) triggered worrying epidemics. But the reach of these pathogens was limited compared to the SARS-Cov-2 which has taken nearly 7 million lives. When the WHO declared Covid a pandemic in March 2020, most experts believed that humanity was in for a long haul. Scientists in several parts of the world, however, exceeded the expectations of even the most die-hard optimist by producing vaccines in less than a year. The virus, though, continued to take a toll and exposed the healthcare deficits of several countries, including India."

The latest evidence is the virtual ban on sugar exports. For the 2022-23 sugar year (October-September), only up to 6.1 million tonnes (mt) of exports were allowed, as against the record 11 mt shipped out in 2021-22. Mills have already dispatched the entire 6.1 mt, but the government has seemingly decided not to increase the cap. This is despite overall comfortable domestic supplies. The 32.5 mt estimated production for 2022-23 is below the previous year's all-time-high of 35.9 mt. However, it is way higher than the projected domestic consumption of 27.5 mt. And with opening stocks of 7.1 mt, besides hardly any inflation in sugar, there's enough leeway to permit additional exports. The extreme precaution with sugar is nowhere comparable to last year's outright export ban on wheat, which was a response to a failed domestic crop and depleted government stocks. In sugar, there is no such shortage. It's just that the government doesn't want to take any chances in the event of the monsoon turning out bad. But even these worries should not extend to sugarcane, which is largely an irrigated crop. It only points to one thing — a government that will do whatever it takes to control food inflation. The coming months leading up to elections may see more proactive "supply-side" interventions. This is already happening in pulses, where the government has made it mandatory for traders, millers and importers to disclose their stocks. It has also not ruled out clamping stock-holding limits "if the markets do not behave".

In our time, when the study of history threatens to become almost an impossibility—such is the mass of details which historians collect in archives and pour out before us in monographs—it seems to me more than ever the duty of the true historian to find out the real proportion of things, to arrange his materials according to the strictest rules of artistic perspective, and to keep completely out of sight all that may be rightly ignored by us in our own passage across the historical stage of the world. It is this power of discovering what is really important that distinguishes the true historian from the mere chronicler, in whose eyes everything is important, particularly if he has discovered it himself. I think it was Frederick the Great who, when sighing for a true historian of his reign, complained bitterly that those who wrote the history of Prussia never forgot to describe the buttons on his uniform. And it is probably of such historical works that Carlyle was thinking when he said that he had waded through them all, but that nothing should ever induce him to hand even their names and titles down to posterity. And yet how much is there even in Carlyle's histories that might safely be consigned to oblivion! Why do we want to know history? Why does history form a recognized part of our liberal education? Simply because all of us, and every one of us, ought to know how we have come to be what we are, so that each generation need not start again from the same point and toil over the same ground, but, profiting by the experience of those who came before, may advance toward higher points and nobler aims. As a child when growing up might ask his father or grandfather who had built the house they lived in, or who had cleared the field that yielded them their food, we ask the historian whence we came, and how we came into possession of what we call our own. History may tell us afterward many useful and amusing things, gossip, such as a child might like to hear from his mother or grandmother; but what history has to teach us before all and everything, is our own antecedents, our own ancestors, our own descent. Now our principal intellectual ancestors are, no doubt, the Jews, the Greeks, the Romans, and the Saxons, and we, here in Europe, should not call a man educated or enlightened who was ignorant of the debt which he owes to his intellectual ancestors in Palestine, Greece, Rome, and Germany. The whole past history of the world would be darkness to him, and not knowing what those who came before him had done for him, he would probably care little to do anything for those who are to come after him. Life would be to him a chain of sand, while it ought to be a kind of electric chain that makes our hearts tremble and vibrate with the most ancient thoughts of the past, as well as with the most distant hopes of the future.

Soap, salt, candles, leather, and fermented liquors, have, indeed, become a good deal dearer, chiefly from the taxes which have been laid upon them. The quantity of these, however, which the labouring poor are under any necessity of consuming, is so very small, that the increase in their price does not compensate the diminution in that of so many other things. The common complaint, that luxury extends itself even to the lowest ranks of the people, and that the labouring poor will not now be contented with the same food, clothing, and lodging, which satisfied them in former times, may convince us that it is not the money price of labour only, but its real recompence, which has augmented.

A 1984 Volkswagen Rabbit only had 90 horsepower, but its average fuel economy was 34 miles per gallon. The 2009 version of that car had almost twice the horsepower and all sorts of technology advantages, but its average fuel consumption is a paltry 24.6 miles per gallon. Sure, the engines got more efficient and it has a bunch of new comfort features. It's safer, too, but it weighs almost 1,000 lbs more. The battery pack on a Tesla Model 3 weighs more than 450 kg (1,000 lbs). The Rivian truck's battery weighs 800 kg (1,755 lbs). And if you buy an EV Hummer, the battery you're dragging around weighs more than a 2009 Volkswagen Rabbit at 1,300 kg (2,800 lbs).
